ASL 531, American Sign Language III, must be passed with a grade of at least B-, or successfully demonstrate an equivalent fluency in ASL. Students must pass INTR 630, Principles & Practice of Consecutive Interpretation with at least a B- or successfully demonstrate competence in consecutive interpretation. Students must achieve a GPA of 2.5 or better in major courses. Transfer students must complete a minimum of 8 SLI courses at UNHM.
